Overview

The Planning Commission serves as an advisory board to the Board of County Commissioners on land use matters. The Planning Commission has the general purpose of helping the county accomplish the goals of the Comprehensive Plan and the Land Use Development code.

Planning Commission meetings are quasi-judicial and the Commissioners hear such items as:

- Special Use Permit Review
- Major and Minor Subdivisions Requests
- Major Site Plan Review
- Rezoning Requests
- Planned Unit Development review

Alamosa County Code & Comprehensive Plan Update

The Planning Commission is actively supporting updates to the Land Use Development Code and Comprehensive Plan.

Regular Meetings

Regular Meetings are held at 6:00 pm on the second Wednesday of every month in the BOCC chambers of the County Administration building at 8900 Independence Way.

Occasional special meetings and work sessions are held as determined necessary by the Planning Commission.

The Planning Commission consists of five regular members and two associate members. Commissioners serve a three (3) year term. All members must be residents of Alamosa County and are intended to be representative of the various demographics of the county including backgrounds such as:

- Architecture
- Urban/Regional/Town Planning
- Real Estate Expertise
- Survey Experience
- Law/Legal Expertise
- And more!
